



Question of: Promoting Democracy and Security in the Maghreb Region

The DISARMAMENT AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY COMMITTEE,

Recalling the UN's main principle, that is to keep peace and avoid international conflicts all around the world,

Also recalling all the UN programs that have been adopted in the Maghreb region, in order to ensure to all the citizens their inalienable rights,

Reaffirming the fundamental democratic principles,

Keeping in mind that human dignity is the central point from which it is possible to build any human relation,

1. Calls upon all Member Nations to adopt measures aimed at preventing the countries in the Maghreb region and the whole Middle East from falling in more civil wars by:
 - a. Offering financial support in order to help the governments get a strong economic foundation,
 - b. Sending sanitary aid for the civilians affected by war,
 - c. Sending economical support regarding infrastructure and the creation of more medical centers;

2. Proposes the solving of the Western Sahara dispute by:
 - a. Inviting Morocco and the PolisArio Front to discuss the dispute,
 - b. Asking the governments to make a ceasefire,
 - c. Proposing a referendum in the West Saharan region regarding the most desired government by the people,
 - d. Promoting a consensus among countries of the Maghreb Region that would have at least one common rule concerning wars, conflicts and sharing a common territory;

3. Stresses the importance of the role of the media, civil, religious, educational institutions in broadening the understanding and promoting the way of life in Western countries and asks all Member Nations to:
 - a. Create exchange programs with the region of Magreb,
 - b. Promote campaigns that educate citizens regarding their rights, such as:
 - i. organizing a film festival to produce documentaries about the current situation of the democracy in the Maghreb,
 - ii. converting the chosen film into script to play in the public theatre for free on 15th of September, which is the Democracy Day in the world,
 - c. Fund programs to educate especially young people, such as, but not limited to:
 - i. Seminars in school regarding their voting rights, human rights, consumer rights, etc.,
 - ii. Seminars for school teachers and parents to teach them how to act if the rights are not respected,
 - iii. Community centers to be located in the poorest areas with the aim to teach young people working skills and give them the chance to pursue education;

4. Affirms that the countries need to first strengthen their economies in order to reduce problems such as poverty and unemployment, by asking IGOs or NGOs to assist the nations in improving the financial status and living conditions for all Maghreb countries' populations;

5. Requests the creation of a UN fund aimed at organizing campaigns in less-developed countries of the region in order to give children and young people the chance to get a basic education by arranging safe spaces where the students could stay and learn about the importance of a system that represents all;

6. Wishes to remain seized of the matter.
